And this is the spirit of the Antichrist, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world. 4 You are of God, little children, and have overcome them, because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world. 5 They are of the world. Therefore they speak as of the world, and the world hears them. ⁶ We are of God. He who knows God hears us; he who is not of God does not hear us. By this we know the spirit of truth and the spirit of error. ⁷Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. 8 He who does not love does not know God, for God is love. 9 In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him, 10 In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. ¹¹ Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

Continuing Under God's Grace A Reflection on the Past 60 Years IV. Manifestation of His Grace

From the very beginning of Messiah congregation there was always a desire to establish a Christian Day School. Even before Messiah existed, discussions to establish a school had begun within the two ELS congregations from which our founding members left. In fact, our current property, purchased by those founding members, had been considered as a possible site for a school. But how could this small group even think about establishing a school?

Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths. Proverbs 3:5-6

In December 1960 our founding members began meeting in the basement of the Boldon home, moved to a rented facility in January 1961, purchased our current property in April, and a year later on Easter Sunday in 1962 held the first worship service in a newly constructed church on this property. Truly the LORD was directing the paths and blessing this small group of Christians. Yet, all along God was planning even greater blessings for Messiah.

In July 1962 Messiah applied for membership in the Church of the Lutheran Confession (CLC). This recently formed synod was made up of other orthodox Lutheran congregations throughout the country who had left their former church bodies in adherence to God's Word, as had Messiah. In 1959, one of those congregations - Immanuel in Mankato, MN, - having recognized the need for Christian higher education and especially for beginning to train pastors and teachers, established Immanuel Lutheran College & Seminary. In 1961, Immanuel congregation transferred control of the school to the church body (CLC) as a whole. The school's enrollment had grown from 37 to 84 students and there was an urgent need for additional space to accommodate the growing number of students from around the country that expressed a desire to attend.

In November 1962 the LORD began to unveil His plan for Immanuel. A caretaker of the Ingram Estate in Eau Claire contacted Messiah's pastor, Arvid Gullerud, regarding the impending sale of the property on the south side of Eau Claire. Late that month, the chairman of the CLC's Policy

Committee visited the property and immediately directed the synod to seriously consider purchasing it. A special convention of the CLC was held in early January 1963, and the decision was made to purchase the property.

The amazing details of this gracious gift of God to His church can be found in *Out of Necessity-A History of the Church of the Lutheran Confession*, by David Lau, *Throughout All Generations*, by Eunice Roehl, and *The Erskine B. Ingram Estate 1920-1963: God's Gift to Immanuel Lutheran College*, by Lynette Roehl.

The gift of Immanuel High School, College & Seminary (ILC) is a wonderful example of how our LORD at times clearly demonstrates His love and care for us "in the moment," yet His grace through the years helps us understand that His blessings are much more abundant than we can ever imagine.

In June 1963, Messiah Lutheran School was established, and when the first classes were held in September 1963 the LORD had not only provided Messiah with a Christian grade school for our youth, but also a Christian high school, college, and seminary here in town. Messiah congregation has truly been blessed by the presence of ILC here in Eau Claire.

After 60 years, we now have 4th generation students in our grade school and 3rd generation students at Immanuel. Former students from Immanuel have recognized the blessings of Christian education that we enjoy and have relocated to Eau Claire to share in those blessings. Messiah's PreK-8th Grade program has also welcomed non-member families to our school for the purpose of assisting parents in teaching their children about their Savior. Many of these families have joined our fellowship and sent their children on to Immanuel.

Messiah is happy to provide a church home during the school year for Immanuel students from a distance. Our families have opportunities to meet and establish lasting relationships with these young people who share our Christian faith. Our congregation benefits from graduates that decide to remain in Eau Claire and become involved in our congregational efforts. We are blessed to be able to offer our church sanctuary for Immanuel's choirs to present their Christmas and graduation concerts. We also have opportunities to take in athletic and other extracurricular activities offered at

Immanuel. Our pastors appreciate the opportunity to offer confirmation instruction to non-member students at Immanuel. Our grade school regularly provides an opportunity for student teachers from Immanuel to observe and practice-teach in our classrooms. We also appreciate the fellowship we share with the staff and professors at Immanuel, also members at Messiah.

God's grace for 60 years has resulted in many blessings to Messiah and to our church body. Praise God for the gift of Immanuel – "God with us," a reminder for us and generations to come how He provides for His people.

Update on the Building Project

While there has not been a recent workday with a large crew, a lot has been done here and there over the last two weeks.

- School library boxed and moved
- VBS, SS, and Outreach storage room emptied
- Desks moved out to make room for storage of nearby classroom boxes
- All six trees down and mostly cleared away
- Continual relocation of church and school office items
- The old storage garage stripped and re-shingled

We appreciate all the volunteer labor. Not only does it ready our site for the building contractor to come in and start, it also saves us some money.

Meetings with the architect and contractor are held about ever other week as we come down the home stretch of planning.

Note: Since we are ahead of schedule on our end, the date for construction prep has been moved up to May 17th with actual construction to start May 24th, both a week earlier than originally planned.

Our financing is in place, between our funds raised to start the project (just over 25%) and the balance borrowed from the CLC's Church Extension Fund. It is not too late for members to offer a personal loan which allows us to borrow money at a lower rate and stretch our overall dollars. See Steve Lentz for details.

There are a number of areas which the Building Committee has identified as potential "do it ourselves" work. All totaled it represents a savings of about \$80,000. The list includes such

as:

- Painting
- Ceramic tile and carpet

be able to do these projects in a timely fashion and could run the risk of losing potential savings.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; May 10-15, '21

Mon Acts 11:19-26 This event is important because Jesus was turning the steering wheel one notch into the left lane—contrary to Jewish policy (19). When some Greek Christians reached out to their countrymen, Jesus blessed their work—which alerted the mother congregation. After investigating, they learned that Jesus was behind this turn of events, and that's how His Church became prepped for the services of Saul, God's special spokesman.

Tues John 15:9-17 is loaded with spiritual food; today let's focus on the LOVE which moved Jesus to come down to Earth; it's the oxygen of His life and of ours, too. Loving others more than self means serving others more than self; it's where the rubber hits the road. God's saving love has been encoded by Jesus in our hearts, and we are activated by His password: fGsltwtHg*Jn3:16.

Wed 1 John 4:1-11 What are the ABC's of Christianity? A is for Alpha (Rev. 1:8), our eternal, generative Jesus. B is for Beware of anyone and anything that diminishes or detracts from Jesus; our world is full of this garbage. C is for Continue in God's love which carries us through adverse conditions and over rough terrain. Since Jesus has paid off humanity's sindebts, let's continue living in His love – and sharing God's saving love with others.

Thurs Psalm 98 The Old Testament Hymnary has many tunes in the section Songs of Praise, and though #98 is fairly new, it is based on good, old realities—especially God's good qualities and accomplishments (1-3). A praise band is not new (4-6) if it echoes Nature (7-8). We are looking forward to the day when Jesus arrives, and we are ready for His test

question: "What do you think of Me, and what have you done about it?"

Fri John 15:9-17 We already knew that Jesus is not The New Law-Giver, and we understand that *commandment* means directives, so we don't cringe as He steers us away from bad behavior into behavior which reflects God's love for sinners, behavior which builds friendships and produces positive results in the hearts and lives of others, behavior which Jesus appreciates and supports (15-16). God is keeping our world in orbit because it still needs His/our love.

Sat Acts 25 reads like an excerpt from a novel. After the stage was set, Paul stated his defense; when Festus proposed a change of venue that would put Paul in danger, Paul out-maneuvered his enemies by invoking his citizenship right to a fair trial in Rome. His case interested Herod Agrippa, the Jewish puppet king, so Festus rehearsed it for him (13-21), hoping that he had all the pertinent facts straight before he sent Paul to Rome. That long trip to Rome would be dangerous, and his court trial full of tension, but Jesus was still behind the steering wheel. Stay tuned for further developments.
