Explanation of The First Article of the Apostolic Creed (God the Father and His work of Creation)

Communion Next Weekend: Communion will be celebrated next Saturday and Sunday. Communicants who intend to go to the Lord's Supper can indicate their intentions by speaking to one of the pastors or by signing the registration sheets on the table in the narthex.



As an aid to self-examination we offer the following:

Brief Instruction on Holy Communion

Why do you intend to go to Holy Communion?

Each communicant should put this question to himself before he approaches the Table of the Lord. There are not a few who go to the Lord's Supper either quite thoughtlessly or with a wrong intention. Some go from mere force of habit; others only because their parents admonish them to go; others again, because they consider it a meritorious deed to partake of the Lord's Supper; still others because they wish to acquire or retain before men the appearance and name of pious Christians. It is not surprising that such communicants derive no blessing from the Holy Supper but grow worse as time goes on.

A communicant who wishes to receive the Lord's Supper to his salvation must, in the first place, fully realize what the Lord's Supper is and for what purpose it was instituted by Christ; and in the second place, he must be well prepared to receive it as a poor sinner who is yearning for forgiveness.

There are those who have an entirely wrong conception of the Holy Sacrament. who consider it merely an empty memorial, instituted only for the purpose of remembering the sufferings and death of Christ. Holy Communion is that exalted, blessed mystery by means of which Christ, in the consecrated bread, gives us His body to eat and in the consecrated wine His blood to drink — the very body He assumed from the Virgin Mary and gave into death on the cross for our sins, and the very blood He shed on the cross for the remission of our sins. It is true, we cannot see this with our eyes, taste it with our mouth, or grasp it with our minds; but we are to believe it, for our Lord and Savior says: "Take and eat, this is My body. Drink all of you from it; this is My blood." Our Savior is faithful and true, and He will certainly bring to pass what He has promised in His statement. He is all-wise and knows ways and means to fulfill His promises, even though this is beyond our understanding. He also is almighty, with Him nothing is impossible. He is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think. If we earnestly believe that we receive the true body and blood of our Savior — true God and man in one person — in Holy Communion, and not mere bread and wine, we shall then approach the Table of the Lord, not thoughtlessly and lightly, but in deepest reverence and humility of heart, saving as did the centurion, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof.." (adapted from Treasury of Prayers, p 46-48, c. 1956)

Messiah Building Project Update

The Messiah Building Project kicked off last week with significant re-shaping of the property for additional parking, enlarged retention pond, and added entrance from the frontage road. Site work continued this week with removal of sidewalks and parking area in preparation of pouring foundations for the expansion portion of the work. Interior work began this week with demolition of interior walls and removal of original floor tile from the 1960s in the original sanctuary and school. Big changes in only the first couple weeks of the project. This would not have been possible without the dedicated efforts of Messiah staff, teachers, ILHS/ILC students, and member volunteers. As on site coordinator for the Messiah Building Committee, I'd like to take this moment to offer a few special thank you's.

Thank you...to the ILHS/ILC students, staff, and faculty who organized a work group in late April that moved large amounts of furniture, lockers, desks, and cabinetry out of the building and into temporary storage. That was a heavy lift that was made to look easy by the many eager hands from ILHS/ILC. It was their expression of thanks to Messiah for serving as their church while attending ILHS/ILC.

Thank you...to the Messiah church and school staff who have been continually packing boxes over the past several months and allowing floorspace to be cleared for early construction efforts. For creating and adapting to temporary office and workroom space for the project. And, doing all of this while still performing their daily duties for the church and school.

Thank you...to the Messiah volunteers who have made themselves available for moving efforts and special demolition efforts when requested by the building committee. The efforts of many willing hands made short work of a number of jobs that would have been time consuming for the committee itself to complete.

Thank you...to the Messiah volunteers who manage our IT systems and equipment. Many expensive items had to be removed from walls and ceilings within a very short time between end of school and start of construction. Phone and IT connections had to be re-established as we moved the church and school office and workroom to temporary locations. It was done quickly, efficiently, and what appeared to be seamlessly.

And finally...A Huge Thank You...to the all teachers and teaching staff at Messiah who have continued to provide a quality educational environment despite COVID-19 impacts on classroom arrangements and all the packing necessary for the building project to start when school was completed. I personally have been blessed to watch the school operating on a daily basis over the past 1-2 months as I've spent time on site with building committee efforts. As the secular world continues to struggle with educating its students, the staff at Messiah has continued to provide high quality, on site education. The smiles and laughter seen from students is all the testimony necessary to show how productive and nurturing Messiah School has remained during these times.

As each of us considers our personal role in supporting the work of Messiah Church and School, and the current building project; I would encourage all to keep the image of these smiling students and the Christian education they are being provided foremost in your minds. Our role as members is to create the physical environment that allows our dedicated Messiah teaching staff to provide the high quality, Christian education. Members embraced that role the first day Messiah School opened 60 years ago, embraced it again through multiple school expansions in the ensuing years, and are now being asked to embrace it again with this current project. All of the 'thank you' items previously mentioned indicate our members continue to embrace their role of support to Messiah Church and School.

The Messiah Building Committee will continue to use the weekly email and church bulletins to make members aware of when their assistance may be needed. Stay tuned!

Blessings from God in Going To Church

Psalm 122:1 I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go into the house of the LORD."

As the restrictions continue to be lifted and members are able to return to worship at Messiah, all of us have a renewed appreciation for the joy the Psalmist speaks of. There is nothing quite like having a joy taken away for a while to gain a better perspective. Think of springtime after a long winter or the return of the sun after a thunderstorm or being able to get around again after a long illness. How great it is to go to the House of God to hear the Word of God.

Psalm 84 describes the great blessings of going to the house of the LORD.

v.1-2 How lovely is Your tabernacle, O LORD of hosts! ²- My soul longs, yes, even faints For the courts of the LORD; My heart and my flesh cry out for the living God.

My soul faints – the longing expectation for something really great, in this case being able to go to God's House.

v.3-4 Even the sparrow has found a home, And the swallow a nest for herself, Where she may lay her young-- Even Your altars, O LORD of hosts, My King and my God. 4 - Blessed are those who dwell in Your house; They will still be praising You. Selah

The Word of God at God's House brings peace as it recounts the blessings to be found in the work of Jesus as our Savior from sin and as our mighty Victor over death. Going to church to hear the Gospel creates a desire to go to church to hear more Gospel.

v.5-7 Blessed is the man whose strength is in You, Whose heart is set on pilgrimage._ ^{6.} As they pass through the Valley of Baca, They make it a spring; The rain also covers it with pools. ^{7.} They go from strength to strength; Each one appears before God in Zion.

Valley of Baca - place of tears, an appropriate description of life in this world where we have many reasons to cry (sin, death, sickness, war, all types of heartaches). But the child of God gains strength from God's Word and is refreshed for the journey through the desert of this world and refreshes others until heaven is safely reached.

v.8-9 O LORD' God of hosts, hear my prayer; Give ear, O God of Jacob! Selah ^{9.} O God, behold our shield, And look upon the face of Your anointed.

Another blessing of going to God's House – prayer, with the sure confidence of receiving help.

v.10-11 For a day in Your courts is better than a thousand. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God Than dwell in the tents of wickedness. ^{11.} For the LORD God is a sun and shield; The LORD will give grace and glory; No good thing will He withhold From those who walk uprightly.

God has a house,
Wickedness has only a tent.
One is permanent, the other temporary.
One provides a strong shelter, the other not.
Look at all the blessings to be found at God's House

v.12 O LORD of hosts, Blessed is the man who trusts in You!

News from around the CLC

ILHS Art Teacher Needed: Immanuel Lutheran High School in Eau Claire is seeking a member from one of our CLC congregations as an instructor for high school art. Art is a hands-on course which gives students an opportunity to learn the principles of art and apply them in a variety of two- and three- dimensional media. The instructor also would be expected to provide a Christian influence and environment in this class. Art is a senior-level class with 2 sections that meets 5 days a week (45-minute class periods). St. Paul's is located on Main Street in Melrose. A light lunch will be served following the service. Your presence would be an encouragement to this small congregation. If you are going to share a verse and words of encouragement, please inform John Schierenbeck, This congregation was formerly affiliated with the Protes'tant Conference of the WELS. The Protes'tant Conference came into existence as a result of controversy over the WELS suspending pastors and congregations beginning in the late twenties. St. Paul's was served by Pastor Marcus Albrecht for thirty years. Marcus was the son of Pastor PG Albrecht and the brother of "Doc" Albrecht. St. Paul's has not had a pastor for the past four years during which it was served by lay leaders. The congregation came in contact with the CLC in 2020 when a member came across a Palm Sunday sermon by Pastor Seybt on the internet. He mentioned a devotion booklet that he had written about Covid. She printed the booklet and distributed it to the members. It was discovered that Pastor Sevbt's wife and this member had worked together in the Melrose-Mindoro school 15 years earlier. Soon they asked to receive audio sermons from Pastor Seybt which they used in their lay services. They then requested more information about the CLC. After a series of informational meetings, they declared that they were in doctrinal agreement with the CLC and requested membership in the CLC. President Eichstadt declared fellowship. They will be received into formal membership at the June convention. St. Paul's called Pastor Chad Seybt, and he accepted the call. Pastor Seybt is also presently serving the Fairchild, Millston, and Onalaska congregations and will continue to serve them.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; May 31-June 5, '21

Mon Isaiah 6:1-8 When we read chapters 1-5, we may begin to wonder: Did the Jews deserve all that scolding? How could Isaiah read their hearts and pronounce judgment on them? Well, God settled such questions, for His triune Holiness not only rules the Universe (3), but merits universal worship, for God is generous to sinners (5-7), inspiring hearts to serve Him (8).

Tues John 3:1-17 We resemble Nicodemus in being spiritually backward, so God endeavors to enlighten us: we become His children via spiritual rebirth accomplished by His Holy Spirit (1-8). Let's not sell God short on this (9), for we have it on the highest authority (11-13) that God is so merciful and compassionate that He did what He alone could do: pay off humanity's spiritual deficit with His own life-blood (14-17). Thank You, dear Savior Jesus!

Wed Romans 8:14-17 As we read these few verses more over again, we catch the drift that God is Triune, for The Holy Spirit appears in v. 14, the Father in v. 15, and Christ in v. 17. Note that Christ is referred to as an *heir* of the Father (which happens by right of son-ship), and that as co-heirs with Jesus we not only share in His suffering, but we will also share His glorification in heaven. [It's only natural that the Holy Trinity appears throughout His Bible.]

Thurs Psalm 150 Who praises the covenant God, Jehovah? Both the angels in heaven (1) and the saints on Earth praise Him (2). By what means or method does our praise rise to Him? By using the loudest brass and the sweetest stringed instruments, by the piping of flutes and clanging of cymbals, and by using our own lungs, too (6) – for it is right and proper to praise the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Praise the LORD!

Fri Luke 2:25-32 We might study many chapters in the Gospels before we come across a reference to the Holy Spirit. Doesn't the Spirit show up prior to Pentecost? Yes, but prior to Pentecost He occupied the hearts and lives of believers without fanfare—as He did with good old Simeon. We appreciate that. Next, the Spirit has made Simeon's prayer a favorite with us (*TLH*, p. 29), for He has brought us also to *see the Lord's salvation*. Thank You, Holy Spirit, for living in our hearts and keeping us close to our Savior, Jesus.

Sat Acts 26:19-32 Paul saw that he had touched a sore spot in the heart of Festus (24), so Paul eased him along by presenting the facts (25-26) and encouraging him to yield to God's Word, the Holy Scriptures (27) to get free of his sin-bondage (29). This was getting too personal and up-close for the heavies, so they recessed the hearing (30). Behind closed doors they figured that Paul was not guilty of any civil crime, and he might be set free — if he had not made a federal case of it to begin with. [Man proposes, God disposes.]
