Highlights from the June 16th 2021 Church Council Meeting

The meeting began at 7:33 pm with a devotion based on Acts 15. There were 7 members present, including church officers, board chairmen, and pastors. <> Elders: They are working the next steps of encouraging members to return to normal worship after COVID.

Chairman Kevin Hulke has resigned due to an upcoming move: his replacement will be elected at the June 20 voters' meeting. A motion passed that we transfer the membership of: Kevin and Sandy Hulke transfer to Grace. Fridley, MN effective August 13: John and Carrie Reim to Messiah, Hales Corners, WI: and Katherine Reim to Messiah, Hales Corners, WI. <> Deacons: None of the data systems cabling is included in the bid for the new building. so that will be an added expense. Jon plans on doing the labor himself, at a rough estimate of perhaps \$1,500 for materials. The Church Security Committee has been meeting. The cost for training at CVTC would be around \$4,000. We are planning for refreshments after services on the first Sunday of the month of July, August, and September. Due to the Convention communion service, that Saturday evening service (June 26) will begin at 7:00 pm. Pastors: They are preparing for the upcoming Convention, and have coordinated vacation time for this summer. Pastor Schaller led a congregational meeting on the "Joint Statement" this last Sunday, with 55 attendees. <> Outreach: the large VBS sign is up. Outreach is meeting next week and will decide if they are doing fliers. We are also preparing for the Northern WI State Fair. <> Property: Recently addressed: painted the repaired sheetrock in church by the organ; 3 emergency light batteries were replaced (1 by kitchen, 2 in narthex); the riding lawn mower was serviced for the season; the garage is almost done; filled ruts and graded drive leading to upper field. New items to address: Tim Schaller needs to step down from BOP for personal reasons, and Christian Schaller had to stop mowing/cleaning because of injury. Cheryl Meyer agreed to cover church cleaning over the summer but we will still need a 2nd cleaning person by the time school starts again. The board will cover mowing for short term. A pew by organ is broken, and will be repaired by the company since it's under warranty. Attic venting problems at the Schaller teacherage will be fixed. A Motion passed to put permanent "No Parking" signs on one side of the south driveway. Directed Jer LeDuc to communicate with Seth and the neighbors prior to determining which side and where to put them. <> Board of Education and Principal: Summer VBS planning is going well. They discussed painting lockers during

construction project. Our new 5-6 grade teacher, Nathan Buck, will be arriving around Convention time. We are in touch with him about his housing needs. We are tentatively planning on starting next school year mask-free. Since we didn't have the Pre-K & kindergarten roundups this year, the school secretary is calling families to get an idea of who will be attending school this fall. Treasurer: YTD receipts are \$301K, and disbursements are \$312K. There is a balance in the General Fund of \$32,459, down from the balance of \$43,162 on Jan. 1. The non-budgetary fund balance (including Building Fund, Helping Hands, Current Project Fund, etc.) is \$357,999. CLC General Fund contributions total \$83,838, which is 42% of our year-end goal of \$200,000. Building fund contributions continue to come in. <> Building project: We are currently waiting for the building permits from the city, which are being delayed, so we are getting behind schedule. The updated project photo album can be viewed at tinyurl.com/m-build-pics. <> Christmas Eve: The Council voted to recommend to the voters that we only have one Christmas Eve service this year, rather than a split service. <> The next Council meeting is scheduled for July 21 at 6:30 pm. <> A Special Voter's meeting is scheduled for June 20 after worship to discuss membership matters, elect a new Elder and a chairman, as well as a new member on the Board of Property. We will also set the Messiah ILHS Student Aid Grant Fund budget, and receive a Building Committee update. <> The next Quarterly Voter's Meeting is will be on Sunday, July 25 at 6:30 pm. <> The meeting adjourned at 8:59 pm.



Kinship COVID Aid: With the recent surge of COVID infections in Asia, our brothers and sisters in Christ in India, Nepal, Myanmar, and Bangladesh are suffering as they struggle to stay healthy and provide for daily necessities due to the lockdown measures that are being strictly enforced. Both the CLCI and BELC report deaths of pastors and members. Also, Pastor Jyothi in India was

hospitalized and was very near death. He was able to receive care in an ICU bed for a few weeks where he received lifesaving treatments while he was unconscious for several days. We thank our Savior that Jyothi has recently been released from the hospital and is staying with a relative near the hospital. He is currently receiving oxygen and injections to prevent blood clots. With all of this and more, the CLC Board of Missions and the KINSHIP Committee have decided to provide financial help to assist with humanitarian efforts and medical bills. Offerings to the KINSHIP General Fund will help with this effort to help those who are suffering in Asia at this time. Please remember our brethren in your prayers!

General Fund – May offerings: \$75,475 vs disbursements: \$93,875, resulted in a net shortfall for the month of \$18,400, increasing the General Fund deficit to –\$73,917. Offerings to date are short of our CBP estimated revenue by \$123,155, but YTD disbursements are \$49,238 less than estimated expenses. The four Boards (Missions, Trustees, Regents, & Ed Pub) appear to be on track to close the fiscal year under budget. And we have been blessed with a Reserve from previous years of the Lord's abundant blessings.

ILC Operations – May revenue: \$91,658 (incl \$49,500 subsidy) vs disbursements: \$116,151, but still maintaining a substantial balance of \$55,590 in this last month of the fiscal year ending June 30. YTD ILC disbursements are \$66,924 less than YTD budgeted expenses.

ILC Building Projects – May offerings: \$1,660 vs disbursements of \$10,847 for the design fees & drawings for the proposed new gym. May earnings (Div/Int) were \$1,463 (YTD \$61,057). The 2021 Convention Prospectus (pp 93-105) contains footprints & renderings of the multi-level facility.

CEF – May revenue: \$21,546 (\$40 offerings, \$21,506 CEF loan payments) vs disbursements: \$15,873 (incl \$12,000 note repayment). The Trustees have funded CEF loans to 2 congregations this fiscal year, totaling \$200,000, and approved CEF building loans for 2 others totaling \$1.58 million.

MDF – May offerings: \$7,540 vs disbursements: \$37,585, which includes \$24,620 for new building construction & church building improvement grants.

SAF – May receipts: \$6,496 (SAF loan payments/gifts) vs disbursed: \$4,659 (May STU loans/grants).

ILC PMPG – Public Ministry Prep Grants: YTD earnings: \$46,483. Grants this school year: \$32,400. (Note: Since unrealized capital gains can fluctuate (+ or -) each month, those portfolio gains & balances will be reported periodically & separately from the realized earnings from dividends & interest reported each month.)

Kinship - Sponsors/Offerings: \$7,540 vs disbursements: \$19,790 (Orphans & Sem students).

Investment Accounts Growth since 7/1/20: ILC Bldg Projects: \$79,459 to \$1,108,717. SAF Endowment (PMP, SAF, Scholarship Fund): \$159,818 to \$3,538,434. Investment Pool (CEF,CLC Foundation, IIF, Reserve Fund): \$1,461,796 to \$3,792,314. Growth of these accounts is mainly from unrealized capital gains, earnings (dividends & interest), & revenue from CEF & SAF loan repayments, less disbursements for new loans from the CEF & SAF, and realized earnings for the purposes of each fund. Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; June 21-26, '21

Mon Ezekiel 17:22-24 Need help with this parable? Read the rest of the chapter, for the *tender*, *young twig* appears to be the spiritual side of Israel, where God *exalts what is lowly*, takes what is *dry and makes it flourish* (24). This prediction for Israel melds into a prophecy for others, and fits the case of Christians who are afflicted by Satan, world, and their own sinful nature.

Tues Mark 4:26-34 What force causes the seed to sprout, makes it grow through natural stages, and develop into seed-heads? This is not a lesson in botany, but insight into God's Word producing grand results in His kingdom (26-29). Putting it another way, God takes a small nucleus and makes it grow into a sheltering refuge for travelers on their flight homeward (30-32). We have seen God doing that miracle in our own town and congregation.

Wed 2 Corinthians 5:1-10 Our earthly life is like living in tents and moving from one campground to another because we don't own real estate. Now then, since heaven is our home and God has *prepared us for this very thing*, (8-9), we trust God to honor our reservation when we show up to claim it.

Thurs Psalm 92 honors God for producing us in His workshop, thus making us His workmanship. Tough He's not finished with us, we are winners already (1-5). Note: palm trees are good for producing edibles, and cedars are good for lumber - - so both have their places among God's abundant blessings.

Fri Matthew 13:24-30 and 36-43 This message from Jesus humbles us, for He is giving us the bad news that Satan can infiltrate the ranks of confessing Christians; such hypocrites may escape detection in our congregations and fellowship for a lifetime - - until Jesus pulls them out and puts them where they belong. [Now, don't skip the closing verse, 43; it's good news.]

Sat Acts 27:39-28:1 Some might say that God was wasting time with those sailors, soldiers, and passengers at the mercy of the storm, but we know better, for they were not at the mercy of the storm but rather at the mercy of God. They had lost the cargo, the ship's running gear, and their personal belongings—so all they had left were their own lives. When the desperate soldiers planned to kill the prisoners, *lest any of them should swim away and escape* with their lives, the Lord made use of their superior officer to be more compassionate (43) and order everyone to abandon ship. So overboard they went, swam as best they could and/or latched onto floating debris, and that's how all *escaped* (Aha!) drowning and set foot on the beach of the island of Malta. ALL this happened exactly as God willed, for He had other plans for Paul, and 275 others had their time of grace extended. Praise the Lord!
