

Offering of thankful hearts blessed by the Triune God

(Excerpts from Martin Luther's Large Catechism, Article III, The Apostolic Creed)

Neither you nor I could ever know anything about Christ, or believe on Him, and have Him for our Lord, unless it were offered to us and granted to our hearts by the Holy Spirit through the preaching of the Gospel. The work of redemption is done and accomplished. Christ has acquired and gained the treasure for us by His suffering, death, and resurrection. But if the work remained concealed so that no one knew about it, then it would be useless and lost. So that this treasure might not stay buried, but be received and enjoyed, God has caused the Word to go forth and be proclaimed. In the Word He has the Holy Spirit bring this treasure home and make it our own.

I believe that there is upon earth a little holy group and congregation of pure saints, under one head, even Christ. This group is called together by the Holy Spirit in one faith, one mind, and understanding, with many different gifts, yet agreeing in love, without sects or schisms. I am also a part and member of this same group, a sharer and joint owner of all the goods it possesses. I am brought to it and incorporated into it by the Holy Spirit through having heard and continuing to hear God's Word. In the past, before we had attained to this, we were altogether of the devil, knowing nothing about God and about Christ. So, until the Last Day, the Holy Spirit abides with the holy congregation or Christendom. Through this congregation He brings us to Christ and He teaches and preaches to us the Word. By the Word He works and promotes sanctification, causing this congregation daily to grow and to become strong in the faith and its fruit, which He produces.

ordered toward this goal: we shall daily receive in the Church nothing but the forgiveness of sin through the Word and signs, to comfort and encourage our consciences as long as we live here. So even though we have sins, the grace of the Holy Spirit does not allow them to harm us. For we are in the Christian Church, where there is nothing but continuous, uninterrupted forgiveness of sin. This is because God forgives us and because we forgive, bear with, and help one another.

Now this is the article of the Apostolic Creed that must always be and remain in use. For we have already received Creation. Redemption, too, is finished. But the Holy Spirit carries on His work without ceasing to the Last Day. For that purpose He has appointed a congregation upon earth by which He speaks and does everything.

From this you see that the Apostolic Creed is a doctrine quite different from the Ten Commandments. For the Ten Commandments teach what we ought to do. But the Apostolic Creed tells what God does for us and gives to us. Furthermore, apart from this, the Ten Commandments are written in all people's hearts. However, no human wisdom can understand the Apostolic Creed. It must be taught by the Holy Spirit alone.

## Outreach Days

Two of our major outreach efforts happened last week.

- The Northern Wisconsin State Fair was held Wednesday July 7 through Sunday, July 11. The display panels from our booth are displayed in the narthex. We also this year had a looping video about activities at Messiah. There were a variety of pamphlets at our booth for fairgoers to take; and there were 465 Silent Sunday School packets and 110 VBS flyers given out as well. We are thankful for our 20 plus volunteers throughout the days of the fair. We encourage our members to pray for the blessing of the Spirit on the Word that has gone out.
- July VBS Complete! Our first session of VBS was held at ILC this past week. Our theme was "Children of the Heavenly Father". This series included five lessons; "Jesus Blesses the Little Children", "Jairus's Daughter Raised From the Dead", "The Slave Girl and Naaman", "The Boy King Josiah", "David and Goliath". #### **Coming Up Activities**

VBS session two: August 2-6VBS in the Park: August 14

## Building Project Update

The reroof over the east wing classrooms has been completed. Outside walls for the new classrooms wing are up and trusses are scheduled to go up next week. Rough in for plumbing has been completed along with some interior walls.

The following announcement was from Tom Beekman

**Building Committee Report:** The Messiah Building Project has progressed to the point where we can begin reassembling certain classrooms in the existing facility, re-install a significant number of lockers, and perform some owner-installed items in portions of the project still under construction. This effort will require shifting a large amount of boxes and furniture currently stored in the Fellowship Hall and Classroom #6 to another location within the facility. We had hoped not to have to shift these stored items until they could be put directly into their future classroom space, however, the unforeseen delays in receiving final building permits has required alterations to those plans. The schedule for volunteer efforts is as follows:

**Saturday, July 24** will be a Moving Day. Most of the items stored in the Fellowship Hall and Room #6 will be moved to a different singular location within the facility. There are many boxes, teacher desks, and other furniture items that will need to be moved. If we had a dozen volunteers, it could probably be done within an hour. The efforts will start at 10 am on the 24th and hopefully conclude by noon.

**Saturday, July 24** will also be Cleaning Day for the three classrooms now available for use. The ceiling tile removal, insulation removal, and new construction installations have left quite a bit of dust and debris within the rooms. Volunteers are needed for vacuuming and complete wipe down of walls, furniture, and anything else in those rooms. Church vacuums and cleaning supplies will be provided.

**Saturday, July 31** is tentatively scheduled for Install Locker Day. Almost all of the school lockers are stored outside by the storage garage. They will need to be unwrapped and brought into their intended reinstallation location. This is a job that will require strong arms and backs to lift lockers onto the carts, roll them into the school, and then lifted off the carts. It would be desirable to have 6-10 strong individuals for this effort.

Please check your schedules and see if you can help with these efforts. In addition, some specialized owner-installed activities will need to occur over the next several weeks. Our committee will be reaching out to individuals to help with those tasks which include adding or reinstalling insulation in other portions of the project, painting, and other minor carpentry work.



## **2021 Convention Summary**

The 34th Convention of the Church of the Lutheran Confession was held at Immanuel Lutheran College, Eau

Claire, WI on June 24-27, 2021. The theme of the Convention was "Still Our Great Commission: 'Make Disciples of All the Nations.'" A full report from the Convention will be published later this summer in the *Proceedings*.

#### Doctrine

#### Joint Statement Regarding the Termination of Fellowship

RESOLVED that we decline to adopt the *Joint* Statement as a settlement of the doctrinal difference between the CLC and the WELS and ELS concerning the termination of fellowship, and prayerfully seek the Lord's guidance in His Word for a different approach.

RESOLVED that we continue to use the doctrinal principles of the *Joint Statement* as a basis for discussion with WELS and ELS on the doctrine of termination of fellowship.

RESOLVED that the four-man CLC committee, in conjunction with the Board of Doctrine, clearly define what is necessary for a settlement of the doctrinal difference between the CLC and the WELS and ELS concerning the termination of fellowship.

RESOLVED that the four-man CLC committee work with the Board of Doctrine to address additional questions in our midst (e.g., role of admonition, pre-requisites for settlement, practice of the fellowship principle, the dangers expressed by Romans 16:18).

RESOLVED that these findings be brought before the 2022 Convention.

RESOLVED that the four-man CLC committee, in conjunction with the CLC Board of Doctrine, continues to work with the WELS and ELS to settle these doctrinal differences on the basis of Scripture.

The full text of the resolutions including the supporting statements will be published in the *Proceedings*.

It was resolved to create and maintain an official "CLC Statements and Publications Registry." The Board of Doctrine will be responsible for the maintenance and administration of this registry. It was resolved that the General Pastoral Conference study the *Theses* and *Antitheses* on the *Role* of *Admonition* in the *Termination* of *Fellowship with Church Bodies* and bring a recommendation as to the adoption of this statement as an official doctrinal statement of the CLC to the 2024 Convention.

The Standing Constitution Committee was directed to answer the question, "Does the CLC Constitution require the president to request the Board of Doctrine to represent the church body in doctrinal discussion with other church groups, or is this action at the president's discretion?" and report to the 2022 Convention.

Missions – The Board of Missions and other CLC entities were directed to refer to "Project Kinship" as simply "Kinship" without the word "Project" and without any associated acronym. It was resolved that the Board of Missions encourage domestic subsidized congregations to open Christian Day Schools. It was resolved that the Board of Missions develop and implement a model for a Christian Day School as an outreach tool in domestic subsidized congregations. It was resolved that the Board of Missions and the Board of Education and Publications explore other ways to make use of subsidized Christian Day Schools as mission tools and report their findings to the 2022 Convention.

Finance -- The Fiscal Year 2022 (FY22) budget was adopted:

The Church Extension Fund (CEF) Policy was approved as presented and edited by the floor committee. The committee's policy added two points to what the Trustees presented in the *Prospectus*. The full policy will be printed in the *Proceedings*. The proposed increases in retirement contributions and compensation were approved. It was resolved that the president form a Compensation Committee to provide a Target Base salary recommendation for called workers and report its findings to the 2022 Convention. Convention concurred with the Trustees' recommendation of establishing a General Fund Endowment.

Committee of Partners in the Public Ministry (CPPM): It was resolved that the Candidate for the Reverend Ministry (CRM) requirements remain as they are for those who wish to serve in the full-time pastoral ministry in the CLC. The Board of Regents and seminary faculty were encouraged to promote the revised Limited Pastoral Ministry program. The convention established the position of "Recruiter for the Public Ministry."

**ILC Planning Committee (ILC-PC)** — \$20,000 was allocated from the ILC Building Fund to the ILC-PC to complete the fieldhouse renovation plan, and it was resolved that the ILC-PC present its plan for the gymnasium and chapel/theater, arts/musical arts facility to the 2022 Convention.

Proposal to Eliminate Publicizing the Nomination Slate when Calling a Professor — It was resolved that the publication of qualified nominees be retained to allow for comments from the body of the CLC. It was recommended that the Board of Regents include a preamble to the announcement of the nomination list, expressing the list should only be considered in respect for the divinity of the call and differences in Godgiven gifts, not in any kind of competition between individuals. It should be further understood that the nominated individuals have not sought this nomination and may never receive the call.

**CLC Constitution** – Bylaw 3B, #3 was removed from the Constitution as proposed by the Standing Constitution Committee.

Conference Visitors -- The Convention ratified the Conference Visitors as elected by their respective conferences: Great Lakes: Pastor Andrew Schaller; Minnesota: Pastor James Albrecht; Pacific Coast: Pastor David Naumann; West Central: Pastor Michael Roehl; South Eastern: Pastor Matthew Hanel.

Membership: Teachers, Nathan Buck and Benjamin Hansen; Pastors Cory Drehle, Drew Naumann, Samuel Naumann, Johnathan Schnose; and Professor Daniel Schierenbeck were accepted as voting members of the Church of the Lutheran Confession. Our Shepherd Lutheran Church (Conroe, TX) and St. Paul's Lutheran Church (Melrose, WI) were ratified into congregational membership of the CLC. The declaration of fellowship with Bangladesh Lutheran Church Mission was ratified. The dissolution of four congregations was acknowledged with regret: Bethel Lutheran

Elections — The following were re-elected, President: Pastor Michael Eichstadt, Moderator: Pastor Paul Nolting, Secretary: Pastor Wayne Eichstadt, Board of Trustees: Pastor Michael Roehl, Mr. Neal Wietgrefe, Board of Regents: Teacher Matthew Thurow, Mr. Steve Ludvigson, Board of Missions: Pastor Rob Sauers, Board of Education and Publications: Teacher Seth Schaller, Mr. Rick Nelson. Newly elected: Pastor Michael Wilke, Vice President and Mr. Jeff Radichel, Board of Missions. (Since this Convention was the delayed 2020 convention, officers were elected to one-year terms, and board members were elected to three-year terms.) It was resolved that nominations for officers and board members are to be made before convention or through the written nomination at Convention. Nominations from the floor will be allowed if a bio has been provided and willingness to serve has been verified. It was resolved to continue using electronic voting.

Appointments for periodical editors were ratified: Professor Paul Naumann (Lutheran Spokesman), Pastor Wayne Eichstadt (Journal of Theology), Pastor Nathan Pfeiffer (Ministry by Mail); Pastor David Pfeiffer (Daily Rest); and Pastor Glenn Oster (CLC Webmaster). **Convention** — The Convention Communion Service offering was designated for the CLC General Fund \$3,640.15. Lord-willing, the next convention will be held on the Immanuel Lutheran College Campus, **June 23-26, 2022** (Thursday through Sunday).

Note: The CLC Coordinating Council's next meeting is set for September 22, 2021 (9:00 a.m.)—Boards meet September 20-21. Mon Amos 7:10-15 It helps to know that the Hebrews were split North and South, and God sent Amos to denounce both sections for deserting God. That didn't sit well with the archbishop of Bethel (10-11), who forbade Amos use of the royal chapel for his pulpit. "Go home!" (12-13) Amos admitted that he had no skin in the game (14), but since the LORD had signed him up, he had no choice but to obey God's directives (15). What a stout fellow!

**Tues Mark 6:7-13** Miracles are God's power tools; He uses them as needed in the up-building of His Kingdom. People are impressed by miracles; they can carry enough clout to strike Satan out of his stadium (7). Further, God opens hearts and homes for His missionaries (8-10), because most people want to be on God's side, not on Satan's team, a squad of losers (11-13).

**Wed Ephesians 1:3-14** What a great line-up of blessings we have! Even prior to Creation, God chose to adopt us into His family (3-5). Why? Because He is goodhearted and generous (5-6). What else does He accomplish with His love? He transfers to us the value of Jesus' self-sacrifice (7-8)--which is no longer a secret, for He has *made it known* to us that Jesus Christ is the key to God's heart and plans, all the way into His living room (9-14). Praise the Lord!

Thurs Psalm 78 God's plans were no secret to ancient Israel, where parents schooled their children in God's Word—Reader's Digest version (12-30). We get choked up to hear how the Hebrews bounced back and forth (over the centuries) between rebellion and repenting, and how God forgave their iniquity over and over again (32-66) until He chose David to shepherd His people. Bottom line: God is greater than anyone would ever expect.

**Fri Matthew 15:21-28** Jesus took a detour into Philistia, a non-Jewish land, a leftover of heathen Canaan. For what good reason did He do so? To have mercy on that particular woman burdened by love for her suffering child. When Jesus put her love to the test—and the courage of faith, too—she held fast to both, which Jesus expected and rewarded. She depended on Jesus to help her, despite their ethnic difference. [Note: God is not a racist.]

Sat Acts 28:25-31 History does repeat itself, doesn't it? In Paul's day, God opened His heart again and again to people He had selected for great blessing—but His love bounced off them like water off a duck's back (26-27). God could have bottled up His love and never let it breathe again, but He chose a different course – to pour out His love onto all humanity (28).

God kept Paul busy *preaching the kingdom of God* to everyone and anyone within earshot. God's love shined into that coroner of the world hour after hour, from sunrise to sunset, for two whole years. Amen.
