


provided. Games and fellowship time will follow – please come!

Mrs. Louise Mayhew has received the call to serve a one-year, part-time call, teaching the upper grades at Grace Lutheran School, Valentine, NE. Michael Sprengeler has received the calls to Redeemer Lutheran Church, Bowdle, SD, as well as to Zion Lutheran Church, Ipswich, SD.



Highlights from the August 18th, 2021 Church Council Meeting

The meeting began at 6:32 pm with a devotion based on Psalm 31:1-5. There were 8 members present, including church officers, board chairmen, and pastors. <> Elders: They are encouraging all members in return to worship together. Membership matters: Motions passed to accept

Doreen Iverson by transfer from St. John's, Okabena, MN and David and Sarah Schaller, with their children Laura and Simeon by transfer from Redeemer, Sister Lakes, MI. A motion passed to recommend to the voters the termination of DeAndre & Alyse Harvey according to Bylaw 2.08a, along with their children Trenton, Trevionte and Aniyah, according to Bylaw 2.03. They do not wish to continue as members. Weddings: Morgan Lone and Jamison Irvine on July 31st by Pastor Naumann in Fairchild; Kendra Naumann and Nathan Rodebaugh on August 7th by Pastor Schaller at Messiah. Several adult instruction classes are completed and receptions into membership are coming, God willing. The pastors have been asked to prepare a discussion document on the role of women in the church and how it is practiced in our congregation. The Elders will then discuss the topic. <> Deacons: At present we are not making any changes to services for COVID safety measures. Messiah's Security Team will receive CVTC security training in September/October, at a cost of \$4,000. There will be up to 18 participants, including a number of MLS faculty. The Hymnal Committee is currently evaluating the Lutheran Service Book. The Tech Committee is wiring the new addition and finalizing the new phone system. Their budget is exhausted & they still have expenses coming (~\$3K) to properly equip our school expansion. A motion passed to allocate up to \$3,000 from the Messiah School Fund for wiring and infrastructure-related items. <> Pastors: We are almost done with pastoral vacations. An additional wedding (LeDoux/Ciokiewicz) coming up on Aug. 28. The Porkies camping trip went very well (about 40 attended), and presents unique

opportunities to connect with our youth. <> Outreach: Our 1-day VBS in the park was successful, with 12 students (1 non-member). "Here We Grow Again" is coming up with Messiah providing church information for 500 bags to participants. <> Property: We had 22 volunteers at the last church workday on July 31, and got a lot done around the property and in the teacherage. We completed the "BoP Responsibilities" document and other outside tasks. The garage fascia is now finished. Hovland's replaced the AC at Pastor Schaller's house. New items: leak at the teacherage, narthex roof above exit door to pastor offices. wasp nests, sand in the parking lot, quote cost for half-curb along parsonage driveway to stop erosion, options to relocate garbage and dumpster for snow removal, outside benches, electrical panel at the teacherage, church carpets. Pending items also include: kitchen refrigerator repair, fabric on 2 pews and repair of another (covered by warranty), fill 2nd school and church custodial position, attic venting problems at Schaller parsonage, "no parking" signs for 1 or both sides of Harrison St. gutters & fascia problems at Schaller parsonage & teacherage. carpeting at the Schaller parsonage, upper field driveway improvements, clearing yard space to the right of Schaller parsonage/garage. The next church workday is planned for August 28th (last Saturday of the month). <> Board of Education and **Principal:** COVID restrictions have been removed for this school year. The 2nd VBS session went well with 50 attending (45 members and 5 non-members). We plan to restart Sunday School Sept 11-12. Fall coaches and sports schedules are in place. We are working on painting lockers and the fall work day list. We have a few changes in enrollment, which is now projected to be 132 students. Volunteer help for getting the school ready has been light, and may put the start date for school in jeopardy. <> Treasurer: A motion passed to approve the current list of bills for payment as presented. Recent generous donations to various funds have provided much-needed help to our General Fund, our Building Fund, and various non-budgetary needs. The totals will be reflected in next month's financial report. "Praise to the Lord for the blessings on our membership!" <> Building project -Major work continues to get the renovated portion of the project ready for school, prior to Sept. 7. Church and school offices are being moved to temporary locations to make room for the 5-6 class in the fellowship hall. Personal loans for the building have all been received. The CLC-CEF mortgage has been signed. Miscellaneous: * A motion passed that the offering for Mission Festival be split between Kinship and the CLC Mission Development Fund. * The Chairman asked boards to discuss potential topics for them to study at a retreat this fall. * Current Projects List: the only project currently on the list is new hymnals. Council will be considering other items to be added to this list. <> The next Council meeting is scheduled for September 15th at 5:30 pm. > The meeting adjourned at 8:14 pm.





Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Aug. 23-28, '21

Mon Proverbs 9:1-6 The Bible is full of picture language, and we understand that here Wisdom is being personified—described as a person who is productive and practical (1-2), hospitable and generous (3-5), offering a lifeplan that will serve us well (6). Godly wisdom is no stranger to us, but a valuable companion at our back when our boots are on the ground (10).

Tues John 6:51-58 Bread doesn't serve its purpose until it is ingested and digested; then its food value does some good. Eating Jesus does not mean cannibalism or the Lord's Supper, but is picture language for appropriating His person, letting Him provide support from the inside-out. Verse 35 is the key; eating and inwardly digesting Jesus = becoming united with Him and receiving His accomplishments in humble faith. Simple enough.

Wed Ephesians 5:15-21 Now, when we have appropriated/ingested Jesus in our hearts, what is He going to do inside there? He's going to re-configure our mother board, change our default settings, and enlarge our parameters — so that we can maneuver around life's low spots (15-18) and take the high road, devoted to godly messaging and loving devotion to one another.

Thurs Psalm 1 [We knew it was coming] This psalm describes how Christians conduct themselves when rubbing elbows with raw humanity. First, we don't fall for the spiel of ungodly people; they don't have God's blessing. Second, we take the high road, not the low road. Third, we don't set ourselves down on the bleachers of the opposing team. Rather, in contrast, we enjoy Bible study because that's how God gets us to grow and prosper—while losers stay losers (4-5). Lord, have mercy on our generation!

Fri John 7:37-43 What Jesus calls "living water" can hardly be cistern water, nor even river or lake water, for He says that it is living—lively and bubbly. Artesian water is bubbly, naturally purified and germ free; Jesus can pipe it into a person's heart, where it continues to bubble up inside that person and floats him/her along all the way to heaven. Now, what IS this life-giving and life sustaining water? What fits better than God's Spirit-empowered Word?

Sat Psalm 103:2-3 The psalmist makes a generous assertion when he says that the LORD *heals all our diseases*. Though our bodies are fragile, our health compromised by ailments, our lives mortal, and medical/hospital care does what it can, the bottom line is that God has programmed our blood to combat infection, our endocrine system to regulate all biological processes, and our immune cells to suffocate Covid 19 mutations, etc., etc. That's how God <u>heals us from the inside-out</u>. Then Jesus heals us from the virus of sin; that's His -- specialty. Thank You, dear God, for healing us in body and soul.
