
Old Testament ReadingDeuteronomy 4:1, 2, 6-8

¹ "Now, O Israel, listen to the statutes and the judgments which I teach you to observe, that you may live, and go in and possess the land which the LORD God of your fathers is giving you. ² You shall not add to the word which I command you, nor take from it, that you may keep the commandments of the LORD your God which I command you. ...

⁶Therefore be careful to observe them; for this is your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples who will hear all these statutes, and say, 'Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people.'

7"For what great nation is there that has God so near to it, as the LORD our God is to us, for whatever reason we may call upon Him? ⁸ And what great nation is there that has such statutes and righteous judgments as are in all this law which I set before you this day?





Gospel Reading Mark 7:1-8, 14, 15, 21-23

¹Then the Pharisees and some of the scribes came together to Him, having come from Jerusalem. ² Now when they saw some of His disciples eat bread with defiled, that is, with unwashed hands, they found fault. ³ For the Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they wash their hands in a special way, holding the tradition of the elders. ⁴ When they come from the marketplace, they do not eat unless they wash. And there are many other things which they have received and hold, like the washing of cups, pitchers, copper vessels, and couches.

⁵ Then the Pharisees and scribes asked Him, "Why do Your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders, but eat bread with unwashed hands?"

⁶ He answered and said to them, "Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written:

This people honors Me with their lips,
But their heart is far from Me.

7 And in vain they worship Me,
Teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.'

¹⁰ Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. 11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, ¹⁵ and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; ¹⁶ above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to guench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. ¹⁷ And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; ¹⁸ praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints—19 and for me, that utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains; that in it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak.

Building Project Update

The Messiah School building project has seen rapid progress over the past two weeks and the conclusion of several major elements. All of the remodelled classrooms in the existing part of the school are now fully occupied and being readied for school. The new bathrooms that were created within the existing school footprint are also completed and nearly ready for use.

All HVAC is installed and operational with both the existing facility and new addition.

Interior of the new addition areas have progressed to where everything is painted. Ceiling grid and tile are being installed, and final ceiling fixtures for lights and fire suppression will be installed this coming week. That leaves the flooring which will be completed over the next two weeks. The remaining

floor is part ceramic tile and carpet to be installed by volunteer labor from Messiah and epoxy another round of coating to be installed by a contractor.

The exterior of the building is complete except for painting which will be done by a contractor. The roofing is complete except for the re-roof of the old sanctuary where the contractor is still awaiting arrival of necessary material.

Nearly all the sidewalks are in place. All curb and gutter are in place and awaiting the paving of the blacktop of the parking lot which is scheduled to occur the week after Labor Day.

Final landscaping of the enlarged drainage retention basin was completed this past week. Rough grading around the building and sidewalks was completed which now allows us to start construction of a significant number of necessary retaining walls. The retaining walls are part of the owner install obligation to be done with volunteer labor from Messiah.

At this point, it is reasonable to see where the entire interior space of the project will be available for full usage within three weeks or sooner.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Sept. 6-11, '21

Mon Deuteronomy 4:1-2,6-8 If we are tempted to close our ears when God lays down the law, we should receive a jolt like this one—sharp and pointed. But why would anyone *add* to God's Word? To create loopholes: "Yes, God's Word is final—except in this case" or "God's Word changes according to changing conditions." [We can almost hear echoes of our founding fathers reciting vv. 6-8 to boost their self-assurance and garner international favor.]

Tues Mark 7:1-8,14-15, 21-23 Self-righteous Jews figured that God had short-changed them, so they added the *traditions of the elders* on top of God's Law. Washing hands is fine, but it does not wash away the filth of *evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders,* etc. So God does it His way: He cleans our hearts with repentance and faith in Jesus as our Substitute.

Wed Ephesians 6:10-20 "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me" is not a cliché but serious business. We strap on the bullet-proof vest Jesus has crafted for us (14), we buckle up our combat boots (15), and with God's Word we deflect Satan's oncoming missiles (16).

Fight the good fight with all thy might; Christ is thy Strength and Christ thy Right!"

Thurs Psalm 119:C (v.17-24) Is it possible that a Christian loves God's Law? Yes, for the child of God knows that his Father wants to protect him from harm, just as STOP and YIELD protect motorists from collisions. We appreciate *God's Word, commandments, judgments, statutes, and testimonies* because that's how God provides direction down our highway of life, to avoid potholes and steer clear of oncoming traffic. Thank You, Lord God, for Your holy Word!

Fri John 15:9-17 We love Him because He first loved us; we abide in God's love as we are bonded to His Word/precepts, and loving one another reflects Jesus' love—strong enough to sacrifice Himself for us. That's how we face our sinfulness, and that's how we will face God on Judgment Day.

Sat 2 Peter 3:10-13 Will we ever get to the point that we can bypass "And forgive us our trespasses"? No, not in this world; Jesus knew it, and we know it. That's why this world with its sinfulness (and our share in this world) must be burned away—as metal is refined/purified by boiling away the dross (Psalm 119:119, Malachi 3:3). The world we live in is mortal, subject to decay and death, whereas God's new world will be immortal, rising out of the ashes of fire and death. It will be a world where righteousness and holiness are totally at home and will preoccupy us (13). According to His promise, we look for His new heavens and a new Earth in which righteousness dwells.
