

Old Testament ReadingMalachi 4:1-2a

¹ "For behold, the day is coming, Burning like an oven, And all the proud, yes, all who do wickedly will be stubble. And the day which is coming shall burn them up," Says the LORD of hosts, "That will leave them neither root nor branch. ² But to you who fear My name The Sun of Righteousness shall arise.

Epistle Reading Hebrews 9:24-28

²⁴ For Christ has not entered the holy places made with hands, which are copies of the true, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us; ²⁵ not that He should offer Himself often, as the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year with blood of another— ²⁶ He then would have had to suffer often since the foundation of the world; but now, once at the end of the ages, He has appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself. ²⁷ And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment, ²⁸ so Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait for Him He will appear a second time, apart from sin, for salvation.

¹⁹ Then Jesus answered and said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He sees the Father do; for whatever He does, the Son also does in like manner. ²⁰ For the Father loves the Son, and shows Him all things that He Himself does; and He will show Him greater

works than these, that you may marvel. ²¹ For as the Father raises the dead and gives life to them, even so the Son gives life to whom He will. ²² For the Father judges no one, but has committed all judgment to the Son, ²³ that all should honor the Son just as they honor the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent Him. ²⁴ "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life.

Communion Announcement: Since the Lord's Supper implies a unity of faith and confession, we ask that those who have not previously participated with us in the Lord's Supper meet first with the pastor to discuss our Scriptural doctrine before partaking of the Lord's Supper in our services. In this practice of closed communion, we seek to follow and obey the Word of God.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Nov. 8-13, '21

Mon Malachi 4:1-2a The final chapter of the last book of the Old Testament lends itself to the End Times; God leaves no doubt about the purpose and effect of the FIRE, and the fuel feeding the flames is/are **people.** More specifically, those people who are *wickedly* proud against God. On the other hand, those who *revere God* will be warmed (not incinerated) by the *Sunshine* of God's generosity. We say Amen to that, and Hallelujah, too.

Tues John 5:18-24 The nubbin of ungodliness is not trusting God's good judgment when He authorized Jesus to represent Him on Earth (18). How far does Jesus go in representing the Father? Far enough to raise the dead (21) and to preside over Judgment Day (22). The Son deserves the Father's honor, and those who dishonor the Son are dishonoring the Father who delegated Jesus to represent Him (23). [The escape clause follows in v. 24).]

Wed Hebrews 9:24-48 This letter from God clarifies that Jesus is superior to every High Priest by reason of His entering a superior Temple (24) and by His self-sacrifice superseding all other sacrifices (25). That's how the sincompensation ritual got capped off. Once. For all. So when Jesus shows up on Earth again, it won't be to bear sins but to carry us home (28).

Thurs Psalm 90 goes straight to God, who is what He is from eternity to eternity, who sees where mankind is headed and tries to turn the tide (5) for humans whose time of grace is fleeting (4-6). As for ourselves, because we are rightly terrified by our iniquities (7-8), and because our lifespan is soon spent (9-11), we beg You, O LORD, to have compassion on us, reform our hearts (14-16), and make our lives count for something worthwhile (17).

Fri John 10:24-29 How Jesus could be genuinely human and genuinely divine at the same time is a mystery—but we revere Him for what He is, true God and true miracle-worker (24-25). No sense arguing the case with those who have already disowned Jesus (26). Note: When Jesus asserts that His hand keeps us safe just as His Father's hand does (28-29), that leaves no room for doubt about Them working hand-in-hand for our benefit.

Sat 1 Peter 3:18-22 Student Peter became Professor Peter, and from his podium he reveals a dark secret — that following upon Good Friday, Jesus in His glorified body took a side trip into enemy territory. Why? In order to provide visible (and audible) proof that He was alive and well, superior to Satan, and could come and go as He wished—no matter where (19). Too late for those lost souls, but not too late for those whom God claims for Himself via the washing of Holy Baptism (20-21). Jesus is in the right position to make it happen. Thank You, dear Lord and Savior!
