He has successfully begun his colloquy into the ministry of the CLC, and is looking forward to the next phase of the colloquy in the spring (a "colloquy" is the process where our CLC Board of Doctrine interviews applicants who have left other church bodies, and wish to serve in the CLC pastoral ministry). Rev. Willitz served as pastor of an ELS congregation in Sebring, FL for 5 years and a WELS congregation in Mosinee, WI for 2 ½ years. In January 2020, Luke and his wife Kim and their five children left their WELS congregation and joined Grace Lutheran Church of Sleepy Eye, MN. Luke is a proud Wisconsin native, but he and the family now live in the country outside Fairfax, MN. He has been conducting services regularly at our sister congregation in Eden Prairie, MN, which does not yet have a regular, full-time pastor.

Death is Swallowed Up in Victory

John 10:27-28 My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand.

Last Tuesday December 1st, Jan Rothbauer received the end of her faith in Jesus, the crown of eternal life. Jan was a long-time member of Messiah, but spent most of her years with us as a member at a distance in Cadott or as a shut-in living in Altoona with her sister Maxine. Jan was born January 18, 1942, a gift to Albert and Dorothy Zank, both members of Messiah, now sainted. Jan was one of four daughters (Maxine, Nancy, Rhonda) and had a brother Darwin.

Hebrews 2:9 But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, for the suffering of death crowned with glory and honor, that He, by the grace of God, might taste death for everyone.

Jan married Ron Rothbauer and was blessed with two daughters, Joanne and Tammy, and one granddaughter, Candace.

Jan was preceded in death by her parents, her brother, brothers in-law Wayne Culver and Dan Greene, Sr. Because of COVID restrictions and Jan's very small circle of friends and family, a short victory service was held at Prairie View Cemetery in Lake Hallie. Her earthly pilgrimage was 78 years, 10 months and 13 days. Mourners were comforted with the hope that is found in Jesus, the mighty Victor over death and the grave (1 Corinthians 15:50-57) and the One who came at Christmas to go to death on Good Friday and then emptied the tomb on Easter morning. Because He lives, all who believe in Him live also (John 14:19).

Hebrews 2:14-15 Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself likewise shared in the same, that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Dec. 7-12, '20

Mon Isaiah 40:1-11 As we access the Gospel according to Isaiah (and since our hearts are still sinful hearts), we appreciate God telling us that He has developed a double-strength serum to overcome Earth's sin pandemic (1-2). Don't let anything stand in your way to get an immunity shot (3-5), for your life is on the line (6-8). Listen up to these good tidings, the good news (9) that the LORD God is welcoming you into His protective care (10-11).

Tues Mark 1:1-8 dials Isaiah's picture into sharper focus—that the voice crying in the wilderness is John's, and that *preparing the roadway* means repenting, confessing our sins, and receiving God's forgiveness (1-5). God had given John the awesome assignment of putting Jesus center-stage and in the limelight (7-8) while John opted to fade into the background (6-7).

Wed 2 Peter 3:8-14 Jesus arrived, did His job, and returned home. Now, why is He taking so long to ring down the curtain on planet Earth? He's holding back until He salvages every soul that can be salvaged (9). Meanwhile, we try to stay on top of things (11), looking forward and being diligent in every-which way to stay close to Jesus in our hearts and lives (14). Is it becoming burdensome for us to avoid hot-spots in our sin-diseased society?

Thurs Psalm 85 We are living in a parallel universe, parallel to olden times when God rescued His ancient people from Philistines, Egyptians, Assyrians, Persians, etc., but not from the Romans. Today our adversaries are more subtle but fully as dangerous, so God has taken care of our BIG adversary (2-3), and we depend on Him to revive us as we maneuver through life—day by day (4-7), holding tight to Jesus' *righteousness and peace* (10-13).

Fri Luke 3:15-18 Religious people tried to figure out if John might be the Chosen One (15), so John clarified (16) that he was but a lowly servant of the One who would baptize/cleanse them with the Holy Spirit and bring them to Harvest (16-17). Those rural folks got the picture—and would shrink from the horrible fire which awaits those whose religion is unpalatable to God (18).

Sat Acts 19:11-20 We already knew that miracles are unusual, but these were so exceptional (11-12) that when some magicians/quacks tried to horn in on God's territory (13-14), God let a demon from hell set them straight (15-16). All of which boomeranged on Satan (17-18), for our fellow Christians came to realize that publications (or internet websites) which promote black magic, sorcery, or superstition are Satan's tools to captivate naïve persons. So by burning the books, our fellow Christians sent them back to hell where they belonged (19-20). In contrast, God has given us the Holy Bible, which leads souls from hell to heaven. We thank You, dear Lord Jesus!
