Highlights from the Dec. 6 Special Voters' Meeting <> The meeting opened with a devotion and prayer. There were 34 voters present, with 7 present via live stream. <> Election - Tim Schaller was elected to fill the vacancy on the Board of Property. <> Treasurer Steve Lentz reported that we expect to increase our General Fund balance by about \$20,000 by the close of the calendar year. <> After a report from the Compensation Committee, these proposals were adopted:

- The base salary for called workers be the teachers' base salary
- The teachers' base salary for 2021 was set at \$2,800 per month.
- The pastors' base salary was set at the base salary +25%.
- (Note: The Principal is already set at the base salary +15%)
- The school technology manager (currently Mr. Paul Tiefel) was set at the base salary +10%.
- The pay rate for hourly workers was increased to \$12.00 per hour.

Sudget - A motion carried to approve the 2021 budget at \$778,000 (the current year budget is \$736,000). <> A motion carried to thank Jim Sydow for his 6 years of service as congregational president. <> The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 pm with the Lord's Prayer and the Benediction.

**2021 CLC Mission Helper Trip to Nepal** - With an application deadline quickly approaching and still so much uncertainty concerning international travel, vaccination requirements and availability, and government restrictions on gatherings in Nepal due to the pandemic, the decision has been made to cancel the 2021 trip that was tentatively scheduled for July with the prayer that things will be back to normal enough by this time next year to make plans for 2022.

General Fund – November offerings of \$119,293 (incl a special member gift of \$50,000) vs disbursements of \$96,054, resulted in a net gain reducing our operating deficit by \$23,233. Compared to last November CBP offerings are \$20,000 higher, disbursements are \$2,000 less, and the current deficit is \$23,000 less. While much improved, there remains a sizeable CBP General Fund deficit. Looking again down the last Balance column above, we continue to be blessed with very positive balances in all our other funds! Our CBP General Fund continues to need our major support since it funds the general operating expenses of our church body and provides the major subsidy for the work of our Boards of Trustees, Regents, Missions, and Ed & Publications. Lord, increase our faith through the faithful use of Your Means of Grace, and according to Your promise, provide us Your needful blessings to respond with bountiful fruits of faith for Your work.

ILC Operations – ILC November revenue of \$85,805 vs disbursements of \$108,650, which are more than revenues received this month, but still much less than budgeted, and still a positive balance!

**ILC Building Projects – November** receipts were \$1,056 vs disbursements of \$1,960 for the Planning Committee expenses. With the long-term indebtedness on the Academic Center & North Hall paid in full from a member Charitable Remainder Trust, the appointed ILC Planning Committee is moving forward with a recommendation for consideration by our next CLC Convention in June 2021 for a new gym, and repurposing the 50-year-old gym for ILC chapels, band/choir practices, plays, musicals, & CLC larger gatherings. Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

**CEF – November** revenue was \$44,629 from 21 CEF loan re-payments vs disbursements of \$3,949 in monthly administration expenses. The \$3 million balance may be needed in the near term for several large loans which are anticipated.

MDF – November offerings of \$10,537 vs disbursements of \$19,789, which includes the 6th of 12 \$10,000 construction loan installments for the Nepal Bible Institute classroom. (View building progress at: http://missionaryohlmann.blogspot.com/2020/12/progress-in-nepal.html)

IIF – November offerings of \$371 vs disbursements of \$3,435 for Covid-19 related expenses.



### Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Dec. 14-19, '20.

Mon Isaiah 61:1-3,10-14 Who needs *good tidings*? Those who are poor in spirit, who need healing for a broken heart, and are hoping for reprieve from prison. In ancient Israel, everyone looked forward to the Jubilee year, when God turned society back to square one. These are spiritual matters dressed in earthly garb (1-3), of course, and spiritually minded people understood the picture language—that Jehovah had *clothed them with the garment of salvation, the robe of His own righteousness*. Praise the LORD!

Tues John 1:6-8,19-27 God gave John a great privilege—to hold high the torch for Jesus (6-8) and explain that his own role in God's great enterprise (19-26) was subsidiary to the person and work of Jesus. So, pay attention to Jesus and don't confuse anyone else as a possible contender for God's glory!

**Wed 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24** Are these mandates? Recommendations? They are exhortations, urging us to be spiritually minded. For our own good (and for the good of others) God is reminding us that we <u>can</u> rejoice always, we <u>can</u> pray habitually, we <u>can</u> give thanks in every situation. How come? Because God is our ally, devoted to our welfare and dedicated to hold us tight all the way to Doomsday (23). We can depend on God (24)! Hallelujah!

Thurs Psalm 71 Since God, the LORD/Jehovah, is the basis for our prayer (1-3), we plead for all sorts of deliverance—just as He has done in the past (5-6), is still doing in the present (7-8) and will do in the future (9-11). Adversaries should cringe (12-13) before Him who supports us (14-16) as we advance through life (17-18). Summary: Since You, O LORD, are for me (19-21), I am speaking up for You (22-24). Please, advance Your Advent into this world!

Fri Luke 4:18-21 Six centuries earlier, Jesus had prompted Isaiah to introduce Him to His people, and now (at the right time and in the right place) Jesus stepped forward. Why? To reveal that Isaiah had Jesus in mind when he outlined the Mission of the Messiah. Were the Hebrews ready for His arrival? Some were; most were not. Same story today. Lord, have mercy on us!

**Sat Acts 19:21-32** Who wouldn't be upset if your life were so intertwined with your religion that your status in society, your friendships, and your job security depended on it? We understand. We've been there, too, but on the other side of the fence, for we are integrated with God and God's religion. Back to the future: In old Ephesus Paul was targeted for his Jesus/Advent preaching, for idolaters were outraged that he had the audacity to diss their favorite female goddess and patron.
