Gospel Reading...... Matthew 1:18-25

Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. ²⁰ But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take to you Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit. ²¹ "And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins." ²² So all this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying: ²³ "Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and bear a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel," which is translated, "God with us." ²⁴ Then Joseph, being aroused from sleep, did as the angel of the Lord commanded him and took to him his wife, ²⁵ and did not know her till she had brought forth her firstborn Son. And he called His name JESUS.

⁸ Now therefore, thus shall you say to My servant David, 'Thus says the LORD of hosts: "I took you from the sheepfold, from following the sheep, to be ruler over My people, over Israel. ⁹ And I have been with you wherever you have gone, and have cut off all your enemies from before you, and have made you a great name, like the name of the great men who are on the earth. ¹⁰ Moreover I will appoint a place for My people Israel, and will plant them, that they may dwell in a place of their own and move no more; nor shall the sons of wickedness oppress them anymore, as previously, ¹¹ since the time that I commanded judges to be over My people Israel, and have caused you to rest from all your enemies. Also the LORD tells you that He will make you a house. ¹² "When your days are fulfilled and you rest with your fathers, I will set up your seed after you, who will come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. ¹³ He shall build a house for My name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever.

¹⁴ I will be his Father, and he shall be My son. If he commits iniquity, I will chasten him with the rod of men and with the blows of the sons of men. ¹⁵ But My mercy shall not depart from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I removed from before you. ¹⁶ And your house and your kingdom shall be established forever before you. Your throne shall be established forever."""



Our Initial Goal is in Sight!

We encourage everyone to consider the Messiah Building fund as you plan your contributions at the close of this year, and into 2021. Praise the LORD for having come so close to our goal of \$425,000 in such a short time! Yet we still need almost \$80,000 in additional contributions to meet this initial goal, which is 25% of the overall cost of the project. We ask the LORD to fulfill this amount also. The Building Committee intends to present a completed building plan to the voters in late January, followed by a February meeting to vote on whether to proceed with the project. It is urgent to make a decision in February due to material costs rising and the need for a May start time. If the amount needed is quickly met, the decision to proceed will be simplified. The building



project is school-related. We are running short of physical space to teach our Savior's lambs. The new building project should meet our school's needs for many years. Please prayerfully consider how you can help in bringing up our children in the nurture and admonition of our LORD.

2021 CLC Mission Helper Trip to Nepal - With an application deadline quickly approaching and still so much uncertainty concerning international travel, vaccination requirements and availability, and government restrictions on gatherings in Nepal due to the pandemic, the decision has been made to cancel the 2021 trip that was tentatively scheduled for July with the prayer that things will be back to normal enough by this time next year to make plans for 2022.

Of the current overseas seminary students, there are currently five students that do not have stateside sponsors. Please consider becoming a sponsor through the CLC KINSHIP program. 



PREPARING FOR THE COMING OF CHRIST WITH HUMBLE SUBMISSION: MARY

Of all those people preparing for the coming of Christ into this world, Mary was the most intimately connected to His coming in the flesh. After all, it would be her flesh that He would take on (except without sin), as she would be His biological mother.

We often hear about what a great blessing this was for Mary -- and it was; in the Bible she herself attests to this. But also what an overwhelming responsibility! After all, Mary was an ordinary, sinful human like the rest of us. As she prepared for the coming of Christ, she not only carried her son, she also carried her own Savior and the Savior of the world.

Furthermore, from an outward perspective, there would be those who would not know or believe the miraculous circumstances surrounding Mary's divinely arranged pregnancy. Most likely there would be those who would see Mary and think of her as one who failed to respect the institution of marriage. From an outward perspective, these things that Mary was being asked to do could have seemed quite difficult and inconvenient. However, according to His plan, God would ask Mary to humbly submit to Him and to trust Him as He brought His Christ to the world in this way. And submit she did, saying, "Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word."

During this time of year, sometimes preparing for the coming of Christ gets to be "inconvenient" with everything else that is going on. May the Holy Spirit bless us with an attitude like that of Mary. May we humbly submit to God and His Word as we prepare this Advent season for the coming of Christ.

PREPARING FOR THE COMING OF CHRIST WITH HUMBLE SUBMISSON: JOSEPH

According to God's plan, Mary was to be the mother of the Christ Child, who would be God's own Son. Also, according to God's plan, Joseph was the man chosen to fulfill the role of father as the Boy grew up. God had planned that Joseph would be Jesus' stepfather, so to speak.

From the Scriptures, we don't know much about this man, but from what we do hear about him, I think we begin to see why God was intent upon this man being the earthly father figure in His Son's life. From the Scripture reading above, we see that Joseph was a decent and caring man. Even when it appeared that the woman who was to become his wife had betrayed him, he was ultimately thinking of her well-being. He did not want her to become a public example to be shunned and ridiculed. More importantly, it would seem that God wanted Joseph to be the stepfather of His own Son because Joseph was a man that listened to the things that God told him.

When an angel came to Joseph in a dream and told him that Mary had not been unfaithful to him, but that she was pregnant as a result of being chosen for the special purpose of being the mother of the Son of God, Joseph humbly laid aside his own reason, logic, and probably even hurt feelings, submitting to God and His Word.

As we prepare for the coming of our Savior, Jesus, may God grant us humble submission to hear and believe His Word.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Dec. 21-26, '20.

Mon 2 Samuel 7:8-16 Via His spokesman Nathan, God vowed to continue His program of blessing David personally (8-9), planting Israel in safe harbor (10-11), and making a house for David via his son Solomon (12-13). Now, since God promised that David's house, kingdom, and throne would be established forever—it sounds like He is predicting Jesus' arrival and successful mission.

Tues Luke 1:26-38 It was Gabriel's turn to announce that Jesus would arrive in due time via the twin miracles of divine conception and birth from a virgin mother (26-31), thus implementing His divine destiny (32-33). How can all this be possible? Well, God is good at miracles (as Elizabeth was discovering), for with God nothing can ever be impossible (37). Case closed (38).

Wed Romans 16:25-27 How do these miracles impact upon our narrowing circumstances? *God is able to establish* us via His potent method of accessing our human hearts, has set His mind to our salvation and told us about it, (25-26)--thus enlarging our narrow lives. Since *God alone is wise* enough to boomerang Satan via Jesus Christ, to Him be glory forever more. Amen!

Thurs Isaiah 9:2-7 God's Christmas Light shined into humanity's darkness (2) (a greater miracle than any of Israel's earthly successes 3-5) when God sent Jesus to our planet as its Governor and as loving Magistrate (6) over His people—once and for all (7).

Praise the Lord!

Christmas Day! John 1:1-14 It's no longer top secret that Jesus has always been a member of the Holy Trinity/Godhead (1-2); He functioned as co-Creator of the Universe (3) and He continues to be our power-plant (4-5)--as John the Baptizer has made crystal clear (6-8). Although He doesn't manage to enlighten everyone (9-11), as many as received Him, to them (us!) Jesus has granted the privilege to become children of God (12-13). Christmas is glorious because Jesus is glorious (14)--and we share in His glory.

Sat Hebrews 1:1-12 The subject is still Jesus, whom some misidentified as an archangel. Just to clarify: Jesus is divine and Co-Creator, but He lowered Himself to *purge our sins* before He returned home (1-3). Secondly, He is superior to angels in every way imaginable (4-7)--especially in authority and privileged responsibilities (8). In addition, the Universe is not meant to last forever but will perish by the direct order of Jesus, its Supervisor (10-11). In contrast, Jesus will continue in good health and strength—for the good reason that He is Creator of the laws of nature and therefore is not subject to (but superior to) the laws of nature. An angelic creature He is not!
